### OVERVIEW

#### Programme Aims:

Students are able to:

- use the platform to build knowledge gained in the Level 4 certificate programme;
- share and practise Māori traditions, including kīngitanga (the king movement), whakapapa (genealogies), whaikōrero (oratory), tauparapara (incantations), waiata (song), and karanga (female call);
- impart knowledge of classic Māori history;
- explore aspects of traditional design through wharenui, waka, and artworks, in both traditional and modern contexts;
- examine fundamental reo (language), kawa (tribal protocols), and tikanga (correct cultural practices) aspects of Māori tradition;
- promote and encourage whānau development and hapū, iwi awareness through marae based events and activities; and
- examine and share the impacts of Te Tiriti o Waitangi to iwi.

#### Rationale:

This programme provides a mechanism for ensuring the transfer of endangered cultural knowledge to those generations who will take their places on the marae.
